EXTENDED DUE PERFORMANCE (EDP)

EDP status occurs when a student fails to achieve the necessary grades/credits to be allowed to progress into the next level.

WHAT IS EDP?

EDP status occurs when a student fails to achieve the necessary grades/credits to be allowed to progress to the next level. Every School has a different policy however some options for students who have EDP status are:

- The student does not progress to the next level but instead takes a year out. During this year the module/s that have been failed can be completed to allow progression into the next level at the start of the next academic year. . Extra modules can also taken at the cost of the student
- Some courses may allow failed assessments to be completed in the next year of study without attending classes – this is known as carrying a module over

RESULTS OF HAVING EDP STATUS

- You are not eligible for SAAS funding as you are not a full time student
- You cannot claim Job Seekers Allowance as you have shown intention to return to studies
- You will have start paying council tax if you don't already, or lose your 25% reduction. Remember if you live with other students this affects the whole household and you may be responsible for a large charge each month dependant on your property council tax band.
